The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Mindel at 7:35 P.M.

The Commissioner explained to the members that the Village has been receiving the quarterly reports from the Village's environmental consultants, FPM Group, on the Lockheed Martin remediation but wanted to use this venue for them to present the status to date with regard to OU-1 and OU-2 and to explain the Record of Decision (ROD) and what can now be done to enforce it. In addition, Dr. Ambron, as the EC consultant, can help to provide an analysis as to which chemicals might be in the water supply. Commissioner Mindel opened the floor to the FPM consultants.

NATURAL RESOURCE DAMAGE PROJECTS

Dr. Phillips updated the Commission on the projects and monies tentatively approved by the NYSDEC for the Village of Lake Success as a result of the State's assessment that there is damage to natural resources. The four restoration projects are to be paid by Lockheed Martin and include a hydraulic connection between Lake Surprise and Lake Success, drainage improvements for the Village Park, a weather station and drainage improvements to Tanners Road. A copy of the outline of the presentation is attached to these minutes.

Kevin Loyst reviewed the status of the remediation of the OU-1 and OU-2 sites and the existing position of the plume in relation to nearby water wells. The ROD signed by the NYSDEC in 2014 provided that Lockheed Martin would be responsible to design, install and maintain filtration systems to monitor and clean-up within State standards any future contamination of drinking water wells in the path of the underground plume.

Dr. Ambron expressed concern over which Manhasset-Lakeville wells provide drinking water to Lake Success and that the treatment systems must be designed to remove as many contaminants from the plume as possible with the levels of many compounds continually evaluated for safety levels.

Commissioner Mindel stressed that goal of the commission is to ensure that the sentinel wells get put in, the water is monitored and remediation equipment is installed when needed. Dr. Phillips suggested drafting a letter to the NYSDEC asking for an update on the plan and time frame for the installation of the monitoring wells specified in the ROD. FPM Group will compose the letter which will be reviewed by the Environmental Commission before presenting to the Mayor and Board of Trustees.

MOBILE DATA SHREDDING

Commissioner Mindel motioned to have a data shredding event coincide with the annual e-waste recycling day held on September 3 at a cost not to exceed \$350, seconded by Esther Voigt and unanimously approved.

ORGANIC GARDEN

Commissioner Mindel informed the members that DPW has marked out a section for the organic garden by the playground. Vincent Lentini will bring it up for approval at the next Park Commission meeting.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Commissioner Mindel motioned to accept the minutes of June 16, 2015 as presented, seconded by Vincent Lentini and unanimously approved by those present.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 5.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 P.M.
