Commissioner Hoffman called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

On motion of Sue Goldman, seconded by Archie Abrams, the minutes of October 7, 2015 were unanimously approved.

Bob Johnston gave an update on the golf course. Mr. Johnston reported that although the temperature remains warm the grass begins to get fragile from the cool evening hours. The greens will be closed for the winter after this Sunday to avoid winter damage.

Commissioner Hoffman discussed the Mayor's letter concerning combining the golf fund with the general fund. The Golf Commission will discuss this further at the January meeting and make a recommendation to the Board of Trustees for discussion at their January Board meeting.

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Larry Baily reported that we are ahead of last year on recruiting new non-resident members. The six month payment plan is being well received by non-resident members. Commissioner Hoffman added that next year we will only offer the six month payment plan.

Peter Chang addressed the commission members on behalf of the Korean-American Lake Success Association (KALASA) concerning the change of fees for walkers. Mr. Chang is referring to a motion passed by the Board of Trustees charging \$30.00 for all walkers and carts during the golf season. Mr. Chang feels this is unfairly targeting walkers.

Commissioner Hoffman informed Mr. Chang the original recommendation to the Board of Trustees was to restrict walking to after 4:00 pm every day from May 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup> and the BOT changed it to the same price walk or ride and did not restrict walkers. Commissioner Hoffman stressed that this motion was made strictly to raise revenue and offered to attend the next KALASA meeting to answer any questions their members may have.

Commissioner Hoffman thanked Mr. Chang for his presentation and added that the Commission will take his comments under advisement.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm.
